- Presentations on mental health (Certitude) and community gardening in Home Park (Freeway Union).



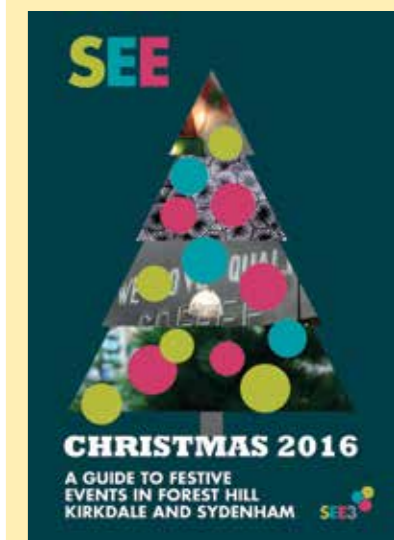
SEE3 Christmas Calendar

Cobbs Corner update

The hoped for sale of the Greyhound to a local publican fell through but it is under offer again – could this be third time lucky? The state of the area around the building and the accumulated rubbish within the mesh fencing is an ugly eyesore and some guerrilla gardening by concerned local residents thankfully over the summer kept all of the trees alive and most of the weeds at bay.

We will shortly see the arrival of two more estate agents to join Robinson Jackson. Kinleigh, Folkard and Hayward have signed the lease for the second retail unit next to Sainsbury's and Lewisham Council have received a planning application for the new shopfront.

The empty unit at The Orb has had its application for A2 (office use) approved and we expect Acorn the estate agents to move to the unit from their current home at 54 Sydenham Road.

Regent House has changed hands and an application to turn the offices in Regent House into residential accommodation under "permitted development" was refused due to lack of information. We expect another planning application will be submitted. The Citizens Advice Bureau has relocated to new premises at the Leemore Centre, 29-39 Clarendon Rise SE13 5ES, a new community hub shared with other advice agencies in the centre of Lewisham. We



are looking forward to seeing a new business on the corner following the closure of the lease on Orange Blossom, the former wedding dress shop. In Sainsbury's local continues to serve the needs of residents from 7am –11pm seven days a week.
